From the Chairman

Dear Supporter,

On behalf of the Directors of Bovey Tracey Paradiso Arts I hope you all had a good Easter break.

A lot has happened since we issued our January newsletter! Solutions have been developed to the serious structural issues uncovered and detailed reinforcement measures drawn up for these areas. We have lost some more time with further conservation / archaeological issues but do not anticipate further delay. The building work contract has been put out to tender to several building contractors with a closing date of Friday 10th May and we aim to appoint a contractor shortly after. We hope to have the contractor start on site soon after appointment and we will advise you of this date when fixed.

Our volunteers have almost completed all the work they can do prior to the building work starting and we thank the team of volunteers for the great amount of progress achieved. We now probably only have about three more Saturdays of volunteer work before we are ready for the building contractor. When the contractor finishes on site, volunteer work will recommence with interior decorating and other finishing and fit-out activities.

To remind you, phase 1 of the development is the building modifications and refurbishment of the Tudor heritage building which will allow the art gallery and studios to be opened. We will keep you informed on progress on this first phase which we are still targeting for completion in September.

Phase 2 of the project, building of the new cinema/theatre and café bar/restaurant, will begin later this year once we have raised enough grant funding to start. We are looking forward to another exciting and busy project phase but most of all to a new community life for one of Bovey's treasured old buildings.

Although the construction work is currently the major activity, in parallel we are working on many plans with our consultants on heritage recording, cinema/theatre design and of course fundraising.

Please note: we will not be opening during the Green Man Festival due to safety concerns.

Plans for the Future



We may be talking a lot about the heritage of the King of Prussia building and its importance to the community but we haven't lost sight of what we have in store for the future so here's a reminder.

Our vision is for an inclusive and accessible community space where a range of artistic and cultural opportunities are readily available for the enrichment and education of people of all ages

Our vision is for a vibrant community space comprising:

- an art gallery and artists' studios
- a new 88 seat cinema/theatre
- a café bar and restaurant.

Affordable artist studio spaces

The first floor of the King of Prussia building will be devoted to four working studio spaces for artists. The spaces are scheduled to be available by October 2019.

Gallery selling local artists work

The ground floor of the King of Prussia building is to be a gallery area where local artists can sell their work in a much needed exhibition space. Many

original features will be reinstated including the Tudor screen and back to back granite fireplace. This will complement the limewashed style walls and flagstone floor as a backdrop to the artwork on display.

Cinema and Theatre

To the rear of the King of Prussia building the Paradiso Cinema Theatre will be constructed. A state of the art sound box will be created where audiences will be able to enjoy current films, live relays, older films, film clubs, local theatre, small scale touring theatre, spoken word and music performance. Diverse audiences will be catered for including parent and baby, autism and dementia friendly screenings.

Cafe bar and restaurant

Joining the Paradiso Cinema Theatre and the King of Prussia building there will be a glass-roofed atrium. Beneath this and extending into the gallery will be a cafe bar and restaurant. This will form a place to meet for all ages, to enjoy quality locally sourced food and drinks in a comfortable friendly environment.

What's Ahead for Spring 2019

Plans for the structural changes been have finalised; the building works on the King of Prussia building tenders are due in by 10th May.

We are finalising the updating of the business plan which will be available to view on the website when it has been completed.

Funding bids are in progress, our professional fundraiser continues to support us with this.

We are beginning to contact volunteers, especially with reference to our heritage work.

Work on gathering stories and memories of the King of Prussia will be starting shortly as part of our heritage engagement with the community. If you have a story to tell get in touch via the 'Email us here' button above.
